General & Round One Guidelines

General Information

What is the Smart Campus Competition?

 This initiative challenges students to create innovative solutions using Verizon's 5G technology to enhance a personal experience, focusing on areas like sustainability, connectivity, and personal services.

Who can participate in the competition?

Please refer to your University website for participation requirements.

How do I register my team?

 Register by completing the form on your Universities competition webpage before the deadline. Ensure all team member details are included.

Project Guidelines

What types of projects are acceptable?

 Projects submitted for consideration should demonstrate a strong emphasis on innovation. The core objective is to either create new or significantly enhance technology solutions that are not only forward-thinking but also leverage the specific technological infrastructure available through Verizon to achieve their innovative goals.

Are there any specific requirements for the project submissions?

Yes, submissions must include a challenge statement and value proposition. Demonstrations and/or prototypes are not required and will not affect the judging evaluation. Teams must also prepare a video presentation for the Round One submission.

Competition Structure

What is the format of the competition?

- The competition has three rounds:
 - Round One: Teams submit a video presentation to be judged by the Verizon mentors
 - Round Two: Advancing teams will create and present a poster showcase that will be judged by the Verizon mentors.
 - Round Three: Selected teams further develop their projects and give a five minute comprehensive presentation.



How are the projects evaluated?

Projects are judged on impact, feasibility, content, creativity and presentation.
Judges look for creative, well-researched solutions that address a real personal need.

Outcomes

- What can be expected as an outcome for the winning ideas?
 - Winning ideas may be invited to expand into a technical trial or business case competition to further develop the idea into a tangible solution.

Prizes

- How will the winners be announced?
 - Winners will be announced at the end of the final round, and results will be published on the competition webpage and university communication channels.
- What are the prizes for the competition?
 - Final Round teams will receive a \$500 award to help further develop their ideas.
 - The top three teams will be awarded \$3,000 and present their idea to Verizon and University Leadership.

Round One - Video Submission

- What should we prepare for the Round One Concept Pitch?
 - Prepare a two-minute video presentation.
 - Clearly outline your problem statement or idea and the solution.
 - Presentation should be creative (e.g., PowerPoint with voiceover, direct student presentation to camera).
 - While the utilization of AI is allowed, guidelines must be followed.
